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Cartagena

Cartagena is a vibrant port city shaped by over 3,000 years of history. Walking through its streets is like following the traces of Phoenicians, Romans, and modernists—from the impressive Roman Theatre to the Arsenal and the city's modernist buildings. Its bustling port connects the city to the Mediterranean and leads to unique museums such as ARQUA and the Roman Forum District. Add to this a distinctive gastronomy and a lively cultural scene, and Cartagena becomes a must-visit destination in the Murcia Region.





Things to do



ROMAN THEATRE MUSEUM

This is the most iconic cultural landmark in the region, showcasing the remains of a Roman theatre dating back to the 1st century BC. Its musealization and architectural integration into the city were designed by renowned Spanish architect Rafael Moneo.



ROMAN FORUM MOLINETE MUSEUM

One of the largest and most significant archaeological parks in Spain, this museum displays the remains of the ancient Roman forum of Carthago Nova. Visitors can walk through the ruins of temples, baths, and streets that illustrate daily life in a Roman city.



PUNIC WALL

This site preserves one of the few remaining Carthaginian walls discovered in Spain, dating back to the 3rd century BC. It offers insight into the military architecture of the Punic period and the history of the city before the Roman conquest.



PANORAMIC ELEVATOR

This 45-meter-high panoramic elevator connects the city center with the Castle of the Conception, offering stunning views over Cartagena's bay, the port, and surrounding hills.



TOURIST BOAT

A relaxing way to explore Cartagena from the sea. The tourist boat sails around the natural harbor, offering a unique maritime perspective of the city's defensive structures, including forts, batteries, and lighthouses.



NATIONAL MUSEUM OF UNDERWATER ARCHAEOLOGY (ARQUA)

The museum showcasing Spain's Underwater Cultural Heritage houses important collections dating back to the Phoenicians. Highlights include the cargo of the frigate Nuestra Señora de las Mercedes, a treasure of nearly 600,000 gold and silver coins, recovered from the seabed and eventually returned to Spain after a legal dispute.



VÍA AUGUSTA CYCLING ROUTE

An ideal experience for combining history, scenery, and sport. The route through Cartagena links the historic center with Roman remains such as the Roman Theatre and the Punica Wall, stretching out to the mining hills and the coast. A perfect way to discover the city on two wheels.

Located in Auditorio El Batel, Eszencia offers a fine Mediterranean dining experience with international influences under the direction of chef Pablo Martínez. Its elegant, modern atmosphere, along with views of the port, makes it the perfect spot for special occasions.



ALVIENTO

Located in Cartagena's port, Alviento offers market-style Mediterranean cuisine, known for its freshness and quality. Its sophisticated atmosphere and sea views make it perfect for a relaxed lunch or a special evening. **1 Repsol Sun.**



CUARENTAYTRÉS

An innovative gastronomic space led by acclaimed chef Pablo González-Conejero, holder of two Michelin stars. The concept blends creative Mediterranean cuisine with local ingredients, offering a complete experience that includes showcooking, a port-view terrace, and event spaces.



LA MARQUESITA RESTAURANT

Right in the heart of Cartagena's historic center, La Marquesita offers Mediterranean cuisine made with fresh, seasonal ingredients. With daily menus, group options, and celebration menus, this restaurant blends tradition and modernity in a warm and welcoming atmosphere.



A LA BRASA

A space that invites intimacy and romance, set among vaulted ceilings and soft lighting. The Doki Doki Japanese bar stands out for the precision in every dish, offering a dining experience that combines aesthetics, flavor, and meticulous attention.



LA CARTELA

Located in the heart of Cartagena, facing the Procesionista Monument and with views of the Gran Hotel, a city icon of modernism. Its kitchen is open from morning to night, offering the chance to enjoy local gastronomy throughout the day.



LA TARTANA

Located in a modernist building designed by architect Víctor Beltrí in 1906, right in the heart of Cartagena, it offers a menu featuring the must-try dishes of the region's culinary tradition. With a friendly and authentic atmosphere, it's perfect for those seeking a relaxed, high-quality meal with local flavor.



MI MARE

In the heart of Cartagena, Mi Mare delights with an informal, fresh, and bold approach where Mediterranean tradition meets contemporary creativity. Born from the team behind Magoga, Mi Mare captures the spirit of traditional tapas with dishes like red tuna tartare, prawn molletes, and modern takes on the marinera, always using local ingredients and carefully crafted presentations.

Festivals



ROCK IMPERIUM (June)

If you love rock and metal, the Rock Imperium Festival in Cartagena is a must-visit. Held at Parque de la Cuesta del Batel, this festival has become one of the leading events of its kind in Spain and Europe. Legendary bands such as Scorpions, Airbourne, Blind Guardian, In Flames, and King Diamond have graced its stages, drawing thousands of fans from across Europe and around the world.



LA MAR DE MÚSICAS (July)

La Mar de Músicas is an international music festival held every summer in Cartagena. Since 1995, it has brought together artists from around the world, with a different guest country highlighted each year, showcasing its culture through concerts, film, art, and gastronomy. Performances in the city's iconic venues make this event a unique celebration of cultural diversity and artistic dialogue.



FIESTA DE CARTAGINESES Y ROMANOS (September)

The Cartagineses y Romanos Festival is a historical reenactment held every September in Cartagena, commemorating the ancient conflict between these two civilizations. For ten days, the city comes alive with parades, mock battles, and cultural activities, recreating the Second Punic War with passionate community participation and bustling Roman and Carthaginian camps.

La *Unión*

La Unión is a town located in the southeast of the region, nestled between the beaches of the Mar Menor and the Mediterranean Sea, boasting a unique and distinctive landscape.

Its Sierra Minera, declared a Site of Cultural Interest, painted in shades of lead and silver with touches of iron, manganese, zinc, blende, and pyrite, gives the scenery a striking character, deeply shaped by the imprint of centuries of mining activity.

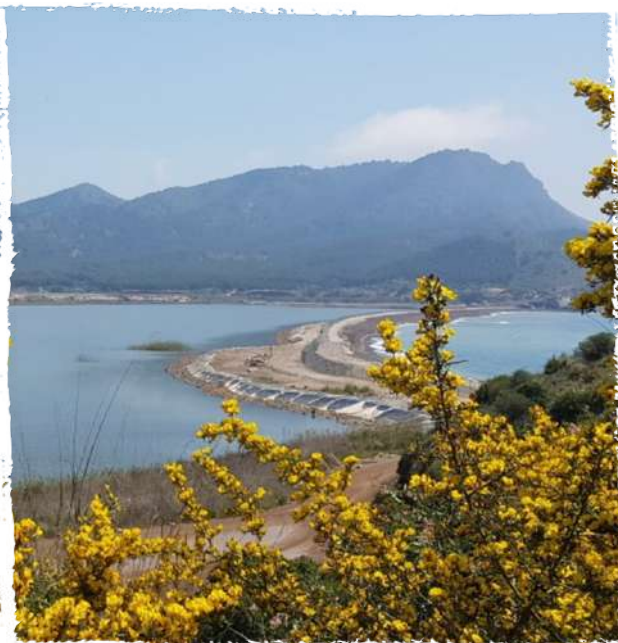
MINING MUSEUM

It is a must-visit for anyone interested in the history of Spanish mining. Highlights of the collection include mining tools, scale models, several rooms dedicated to the miners and their way of life, and an impressive mineral collection. Visiting the museum is one of the best ways to connect with the identity of the town and, at the same time, pay tribute to the brave men who risked their lives every day in the mines.



THE CATHEDRAL OF CANTE

The Old Public Market, completed in 1907, is one of the most remarkable examples of modernist architecture in the Murcia Region. Its spectacular iron-and-glass structure and grand scale reflect the prosperous years La Unión experienced in the early 20th century, thanks to its lead and silver mines. Today, the building no longer serves as a market but hosts cultural and artistic events, including the International Cante de las Minas Festival, which has earned it the nickname “the Cathedral of Cante”. Its lighting and incredible acoustics are sure to impress.



PORTUS MAGNUS

Portmán is La Unión’s gateway to the Mediterranean Sea. Its proximity to the mines of the Sierra de Cartagena and La Unión made it a strategic port for the ancient Romans, who named the area Portus Mágnus. Around the town, you can find remnants of mining operations and facilities used for smelting minerals from that era and the 19th century. The beaches here, calm and secluded, have become a paradise for photographers eager to capture the striking contrasts between the multicolored sands, the sea, and the sky. If you’re looking for a refreshing swim, head to Playa del Lastre, and to complete your experience, nothing beats enjoying a delicious caldero by the sea.



THE LITERARY ROUTE “THE CURSE OF THE BIG HOUSE”

Taking the literary route in Portmán, based on Juan Ramón Lucas’s novel *The Curse of the Big House*, is an immersive experience: the Uncle Wolf’s house, the mining landscape, and echoes of the past accompany every step. The real-life settings bring Lucas’s story to life, blending emotion, memory, and fiction in a journey that transforms reading into a lived experience.



EXPLORE THE WORLD OF MINING

Visiting Las Matildes Mine is a journey into the heart of La Unión’s historic mining heritage. Guided by experts, visitors explore tunnels, galleries, and shafts where minerals were once extracted, while learning about the miners’ lives and the techniques used since the 19th century. The mine preserves original machinery and historical artifacts, offering an immersive experience that blends history, geology, and industrial heritage. The tour also highlights the toughness and ingenuity that defined this activity, making it a unique journey into the region’s mining past, perfect for families, school groups, and history enthusiasts alike.

CANTE DE LAS MINAS LA UNIÓN (August)

The International Cante de las Minas Festival, held in La Unión, is one of the most prestigious flamenco events in the world. Set in the historic backdrop of the old mining town, the festival pays tribute to the depth of cante, guitar, and dance, bringing together renowned artists and emerging talents of arte jondo each year. A unique experience where tradition, passion, and heritage intertwine.

EL VINAGRERO

El Vinagrero, founded in 1910 in La Unión, preserves its century-old soul through old photographs, guitars, and traces of its mining past. Its traditional Mediterranean cuisine, featuring fish, rice dishes, and well-prepared meats, offers an authentic and welcoming experience, perfect for savoring the local history.



TABERNA LA TIENDA DE SOLITA

Taberna La Tienda de Solita brings to life the memory of a 19th-century grocery shop in the El Garbanzal neighborhood, transforming it into a charming restaurant where tradition meets quality cuisine. The menu highlights the caldero rice with octopus, alongside a varied selection of creative tapas, grilled meats, seafood dishes, and traditional fare.



BODEGA LLORET

Bodega Lloret is a classic in La Unión: stepping inside feels like entering a tavern from decades past, with wines served by the glass and homemade tapas, including its famous anchovies and michirones. A relaxed, tradition-filled spot, perfect for those seeking flavor, history, and a great atmosphere. Solete Repsol.



CASA CEGARRA

Located on Paseo de Colón in Portmán, Casa Cegarra is the kind of restaurant many seek for its tradition, family-friendly atmosphere, and authentic coastal cuisine. Its specialty is caldero, a hearty, flavorful seafood rice dish. The simple, unpretentious setting reinforces the feel of a traditional tavern—perfect for a relaxed meal after a day by the coast. Cabo de Palos

The landscape is shaped by small coves and cliffs, giving it a unique beauty. Its seabeds are a true paradise for divers and snorkelers, as they are part of the Cabo de Palos and Islas Hormigas Marine Reserve.

The town features both a fishing port and a marina, from which boats set out to admire the beauty of Cabo de Palos from the sea. Quaint seaside restaurants delight visitors with local cuisine, serving regional specialties such as caldero.

DIVING

Cabo de Palos is one of the top diving destinations in Europe and the Mediterranean. Local dive centers offer a wide range of services, including introductory dives, advanced and technical courses, as well as guided excursions to the famous Cabo de Palos and Islas Hormigas Marine Reserve, renowned for its biodiversity and historic shipwrecks.



CALBLANQUE NATURAL PARK

The Calblanque, Monte de las Cenizas and Peña del Águila Regional Park is a natural gem on the eastern coast of the Murcia Region, between Cabo de Palos and Portmán. This protected area is known for its diverse ecosystems, including pristine beaches, hidden coves, fossil dunes, salt flats, and rugged mountains. The park offers hiking and cycling trails that allow visitors to explore its unique landscapes.



CABO DE PALOS DOCUMENTATION AND EXHIBITION CENTER

Discover the underwater world of the Murcia Region, the extraordinary diversity of its seabeds, the history of the great shipwrecks of Cabo de Palos, the formation of the Mar Menor, and seahorse breeding in the aquarium. Visitors can explore five themed areas that showcase the region's exceptional natural heritage, as well as a large model with detailed geography of the Murcia Region.



CABO DE PALOS LIGHTHOUSE

The Cabo de Palos Lighthouse is one of the most iconic landmarks on the Murcia coast, perched on a rocky promontory that marks the start of La Manga del Mar Menor. Enjoy some of the best views in the region, hear stories of shipwrecks, and climb the lighthouse tower to learn about its operation, the duties of the lighthouse keeper, and other local traditions and anecdotes.

EL MOSQUI

Located on the climb up to the lighthouse, El Mosqui is a traditional restaurant that has refreshed its culinary offering with creative cuisine based on local products. Its specialty is caldero. Solete Repsol.



LA TANA

Located on the Paseo del Faro, La Tana offers traditional cuisine with fresh products from the Mar Menor. Its rice dishes and seafood stand out, and the atmosphere is perfect for enjoying a meal with sea views.



TRIPS SUMMER CLUB

A nightlife and gastronomic venue. The club features several areas, including a dining space, Suggar Trips, terraces with sea views, VIP zones, and a central pool that adds an exclusive touch to the party experience.



CP8

Located in a prime spot in Cabo de Palos, this venue combines the serenity of the sea breeze with spectacular views of the Mediterranean. Mediterranean-inspired fusion cuisine with an innovative touch.

La Manga del Mar Menor

La Manga del Mar Menor is a unique destination in southeastern Spain, in the Murcia Region. This narrow strip of land, about 22 kilometers long, separates the warm Mar Menor from the Mediterranean Sea, creating a sandy ribbon that forms a spectacular and unique landscape. In addition to its beaches, La Manga offers a wide variety of leisure, gastronomy, and nature experiences, from enjoying exquisite local cuisine to sailing or cycling along the coast.

La Manga is the only place on the Spanish mainland where you can watch the sunrise over one sea and the sunset over another.





Things to do



WATER ACTIVITIES

La Manga del Mar Menor offers a wide range of water activities for all ages and skill levels. Visitors can take courses or rent equipment for dinghy sailing, catamaran, windsurfing, paddleboarding, jet skiing, windfoiling, and much more, always in a safe, sunny seaside environment.



ESTACIO BRIDGE

The Estacio Bridge is a bascule bridge that connects the Mar Menor and the Mediterranean Sea. The bridge opens several times a day, according to a set schedule, to allow the passage of recreational and fishing boats.



TOMAS MAESTRE

It is a marina with over 1,700 berths, considered one of the most important in the Mar Menor. It is a common stop for boats traveling between the Mediterranean and the Mar Menor, and becomes a lively area during the summer.



THE LAUGHING BRIDGE

The Laughing Bridge is a small but well-known structure in La Manga del Mar Menor, famous for both its design and its peculiar nickname. Its name comes from the steep incline, both uphill and downhill, which creates an unexpected sensation, especially when crossing it by car at a certain speed, similar to a mini roller coaster.



GOLF PARADISE, ALL YEAR ROUND

Thanks to the mild Mediterranean climate, golf can be enjoyed here 365 days a year. Within a radius of just 30 km, there are six spectacular 18-hole courses, each with its own setting and challenges, perfect for golfers of all levels.

LA MESTIZA

This beachfront restaurant-chiringuito combines Mediterranean cuisine, internationally inspired dishes, rice, grilled meats, and creative tapas in a relaxed, informal setting by the Mar Menor. Its laid-back atmosphere, occasional music, and stunning sunsets make it perfect for hanging out with friends or enjoying dinner after a day at the beach.



MALOCA

Maloca brings a modern flair to the coast: this beach club offers an informal dining experience featuring burgers, creative appetizers, shareable plates, and a dedicated “sunset & relax” space. Its “Pura Playa” section is a standout, perfect for enjoying sunsets over the Mar Menor with cocktails in a laid-back atmosphere a fantastic choice for after-beach drinks or dinners with friends.



PAQUEBOTE

With its distinctive ship-like shape and located by the Mar Menor since 1997, Paquebote is a classic in La Manga: seafood, fresh fish, and rice dishes like caldero or lobster rice, all served in a coastal, family-friendly atmosphere. Its prime location and consistent quality make this restaurant a local benchmark.



EL PARADOR DEL MAR MENOR

With a more elegant style, this restaurant combines refined cuisine, grilled meats, fish, and contemporary dishes in a pleasant setting with sea views. Perfect for relaxed dinners, special lunches, or weekend getaways, it offers a sophisticated coastal atmosphere in La Manga, ideal for those seeking comfort, excellent service, and a touch of seaside refinement.



COLLADOS BEACH

A modernist beach club, restaurant by the sea, and leisure space ideal for enjoying the Mediterranean lifestyle. 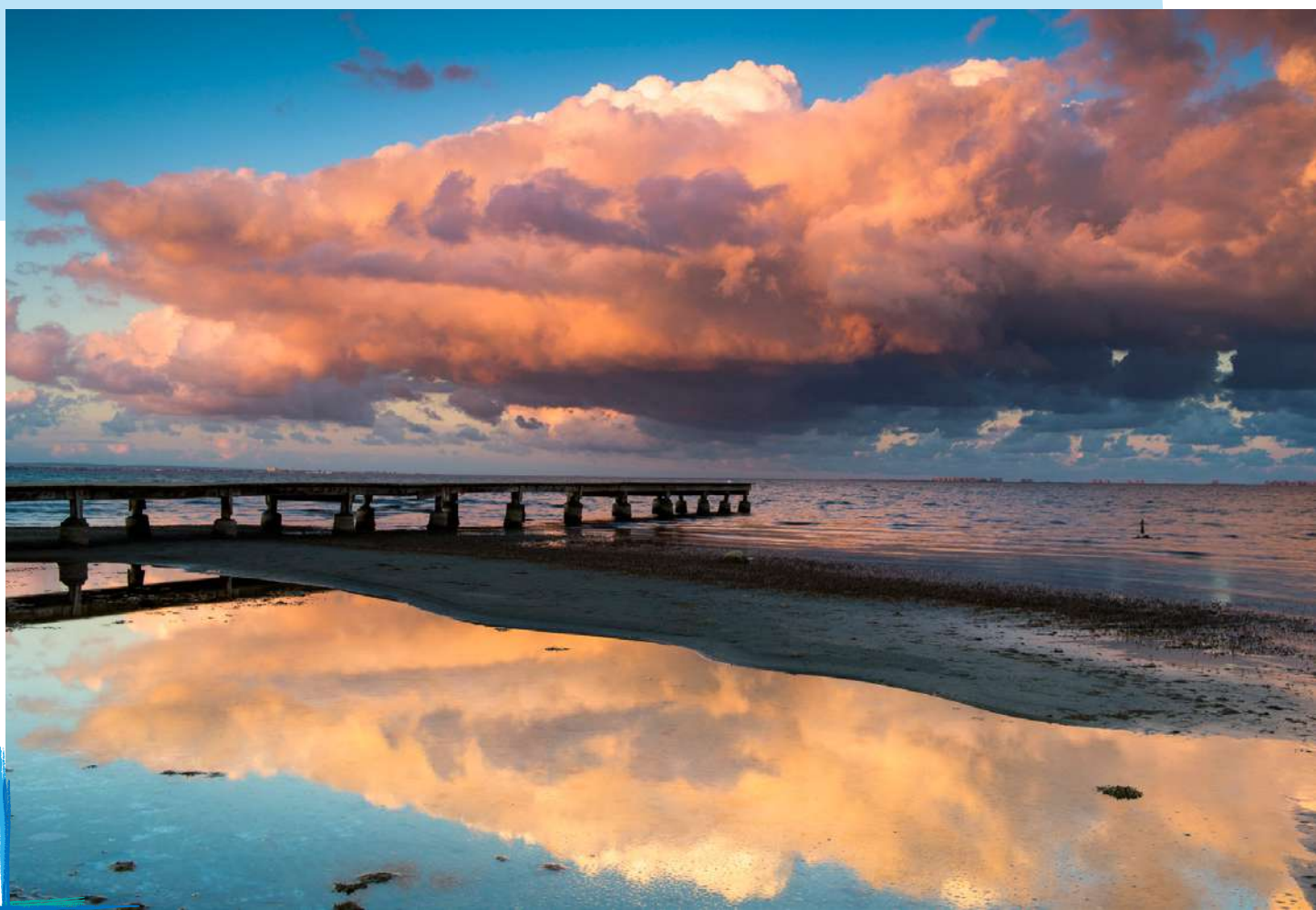
HERMOSA FEST EN LA MANGA (October)

MUNICIPAL AERONAUTICAL MUSEUM

The Los Alcázares Municipal Aeronautical Museum is dedicated to the history of what was once Spain's first seaplane base and a cornerstone of Spanish military aviation during the first half of the 20th century. With its extensive collection of weapons, military uniforms, aircraft propellers, anti-aircraft guns, hundreds of photographs, and notable figures, it stands as one of the most comprehensive exhibitions on military aviation in the country.



HOTEL-BALNEARIO LA ENCARNACIÓN

Built in 1902, the Hotel-Balneario La Encarnación preserves the charm of early 20th-century conservationist architecture. Some of the most illustrious guests of the era stayed here, including King Alfonso XIII and the Infante of Orleans. Visiting the hotel's thermal baths, which historically used water from the Mar Menor for therapeutic treatments, is a truly special experience, thanks to their excellent state of preservation and the enduring charm of the entire complex.

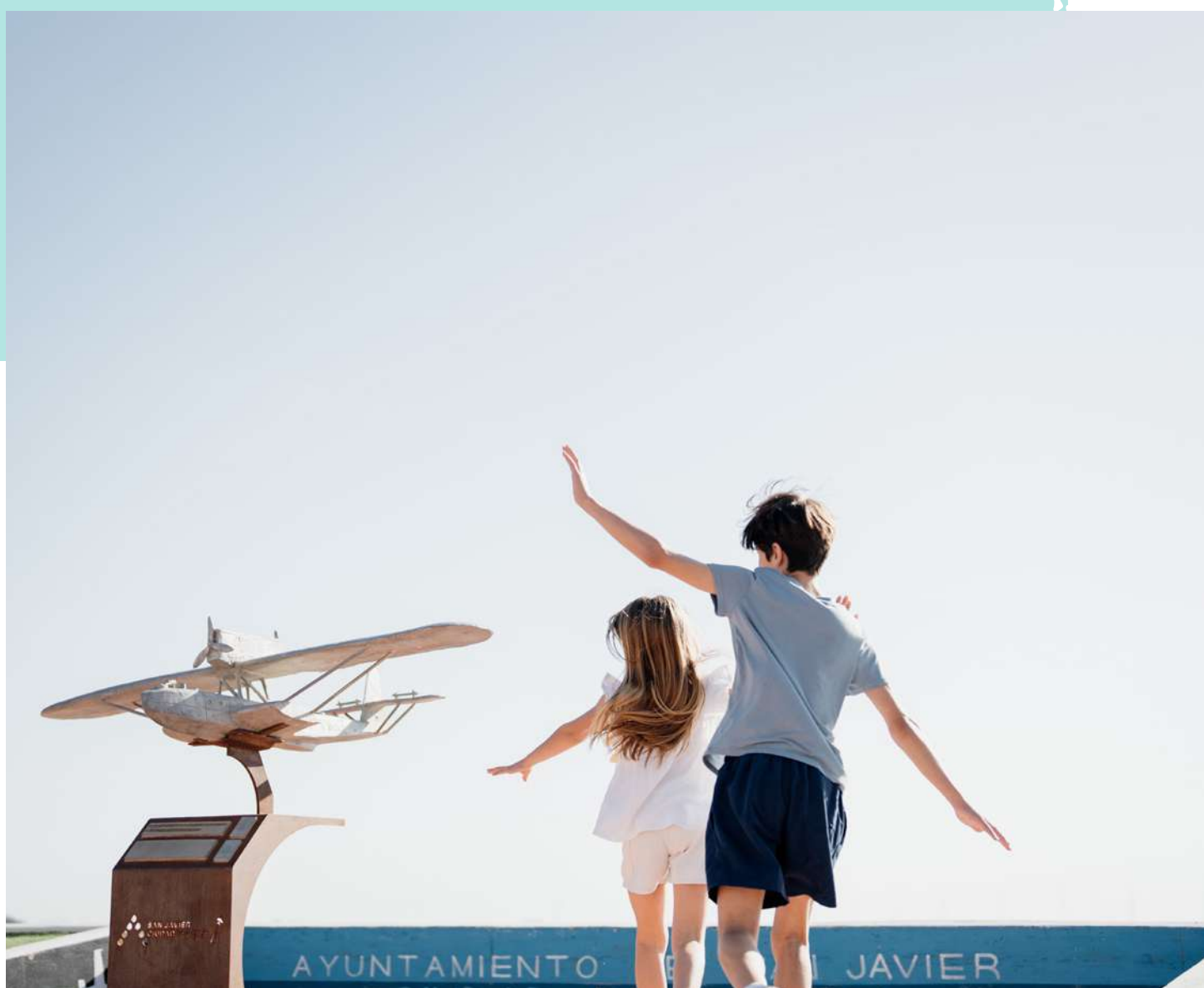

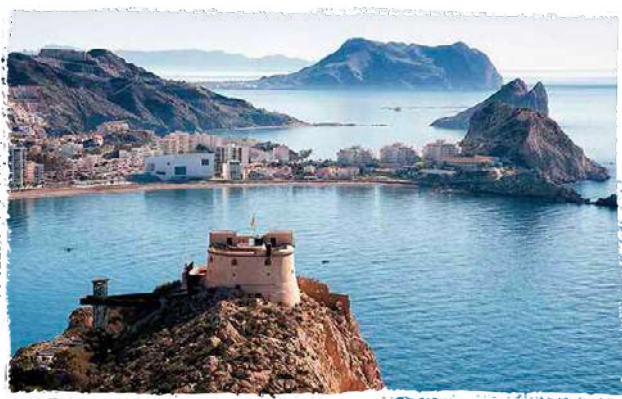

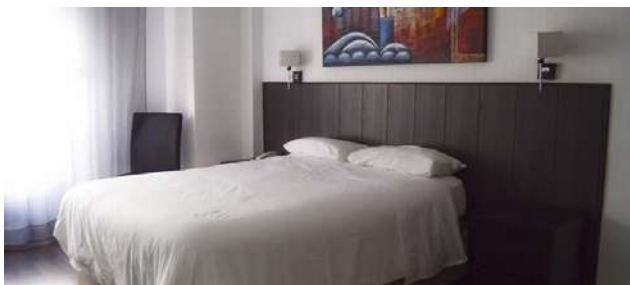
